**Lecturer/Senior Lecturer/Teaching Fellow
in Mathematics Education** (Ref: 14504)

The appointee will share in the teaching of Mathematics Education, including initial teacher education, and contribute to the research activity of the mathematics education team. Candidates must have QTS and relevant subject knowledge in relation to the 11-18 curriculum, as well as appropriate research experience for the grade.

**Lecturer/Teaching Fellow in Geography
Education – 0.50 FTE** (Ref: 30213)

The appointee will contribute to the teaching and administration of the PGCE Geography course, as well as other areas of teaching and research, according to the appointee's interests and experience. Candidates must have QTS and experience of teaching geography in secondary schools, as well as a research profile for appointment to lecturer.

**Lecturer/Teaching Fellow in Primary/

The appointee will be part of the core team of tutors on the Primary/Early Years PGCE programme and lead the development and delivery of the curriculum areas of Science and ICT. They will also be expected to contribute to other areas of teaching and research within the area of 3-11 education. Candidates must have QTS and experience of primary teaching.

**Lecturer/Senior Lecturer in
Social, Emotional and Behavioural
Difficulties (SEBD)** (Ref: 14667)

The appointee will lead on research, teaching and administration in the field of Social, Emotional and Behavioural Difficulties (SEBD), building on an established base, as well as delivering a range of teaching activities within Special Educational Needs and mental health. Candidates will be expected to have appropriate research and teaching experience for the grade.

**Two Lecturers/Teaching Fellows
in Disability, Inclusion and
Special Needs** (Ref: 31775/30434)

Two appointments are sought to cover research, teaching and administration. Specific areas include dyslexia studies, speech and language difficulties, inclusion and special needs, and SENCO. Candidates should indicate in which of these areas they can contribute. For dyslexia studies, candidates must hold AMBDA qualification.

Candidates should note that normally a relevant higher degree (usually at doctoral level) or equivalent is expected for appointment at lecturer or senior lecturer. Candidates assessed to be without this qualification or an equivalent research profile may be considered alternatively for a teaching fellow post.

Salary for Lecturer: £36,715 to £43,840 (potential progression on performance once in post to £49,342); Senior Lecturer £45,155 to £52,347 a year (potential progression on performance once in post to £68,302).
