The MES 9 Conference is a forum for discussing the social, political, cultural and ethical dimensions of mathematics education. The Conference aims to bring together mathematics educators from around the world to disseminate research that explores these dimensions of mathematics education, to discuss theoretical and methodological issues related to research of this type, to foster international co-operation in the area, and to develop a strong research community interested in these dimensions. The residential nature of the conference, in which all participants reside at the same venue, is a key feature of MES conferences and is designed to encourage the development of such an interactional

community. Following previous conferences that took place in Nottingham (UK, 1998), Montechoro (Portugal, 2000), Helsingør (Denmark, 2002), Gold Coast (Australia, 2004), Albufeira (Portugal, 2008), Berlin (Germany, 2010), Cape Town (South Africa, 2013) and Portland, Oregon (United States, 2015) we are now pleased to announce the 9th Mathematics Education and Society Conference (MES 9) in Volos, Greece. The MES 9 conference theme is:

“Mathematics Education and Life at Times of Crisis”



The economic and political crisis worldwide affects all aspects of life including the ways people, and especially children and adolescents experience and imagine mathematics education. Mathematics, as part of life, is embedded and embodied within a variety of institutional spaces such as the family, the school, the playground, the leisure site or the workplace. Social and cultural diversities, global migration, unequal distribution of wealth, persistence of poverty, but also depleted nature and devastated environment, along with increased pressures for technologically mediated societal infrastructures provide a complex territory that cannot be ignored by mathematics educators working from the tertiary level, to secondary or primary and, even the early years. At the same time crisis has its most serious effects when it works at the intersections of gender, race, ethnicity, sexuality, ability, social class, economic disadvantage and sustainability risk. Within this context, it is essential to re-consider mathematics education, life and crisis as entangled and to explore, on the one hand, what are the effects of socioeconomic crisis on mathematics and mathematics education, and, on the other hand, what might be the potentialities and disorders afforded by mathematics education and mathematics education research towards confronting crisis and pursuing a life, as a relational ontology of the present. Based on the above, we would welcome theoretical and empirical contributions in the form of papers, project presentations, symposia and posters that address and problematize the social, political and ethical dimensions of mathematics education and mathematics education research in our lives at current times of crisis.

Venue and Conference Dates

The MES 9 conference is hosted by the Department of Early Childhood Education (DECE) at the University of Thessaly, School of Humanities & Social Sciences.

MES 9 will be held from Friday 7th April to Wednesday 12th April 2017. Conference activities, accommodation and meals will be held mostly at the Valis Hotel at the Agria Village, Volos. The Valis Hotel is located at the village of Agria, which is on the northeast coast of the Pagasitikos Gulf, very close to the city of Volos. In the past, Agria used to be the port of Drakeia and Agios Lavrentios villages, where the production of oil and olives of the area was taken on cargo. Agria is characterized by a vivid community life during all seasons.

Call for Papers, Project Presentations, Symposia and Posters

Papers, project presentations, symposia and posters are invited for submission. All submissions will be peer reviewed by two members of the MES community. A critical evaluation of each submission will be provided following this review. All submissions should meet the aims of the conference and have a clear underpinning of a social, political, cultural or ethical theme. The conference thematic areas have been: a) Politics of Mathematics

Education, b) Cultural and Social Aspects of Learning Mathematics, c) Sociology of Mathematics and Mathematics Education, d) Alternative Research Methodologies in Mathematics Education and e) Histories and Philosophies in Mathematics Education.

Although, the official language of the conference is English, efforts will be made during the conference to hold presentations in a friendly environment (i.e. slow speaking modes, use of visuals where possible). Potential authors who wish to have English language editing must submit their paper by 10th of July. A team of MES scholars will volunteer to do the English language editing chaired by Kate le Roux and Beth Herbel-Eisenmann. Information will come out soon at the conference website.

Submission of papers, projects, symposia, posters opens 1st June 2016 and closes 1st of September 2016.

Submission Guideline for Research Papers, Project Presentations, Symposia and Posters

For all submission types authors must use the template provided at the conference site.

Research Papers: Papers could be theoretical papers, empirical research reports or discussion essays addressing themes of relevance to the conference. Length: maximum 10 pages.

Project presentations: Shorter on-going projects of theoretical, empirical or developmental character are welcomed for discussion during the conference. The project description in written form should address a topic of relevance to the conference. Length: maximum 4 pages.

Symposia: A symposium proposal should include the aims of the symposium, a rationale for its relevance to the conference and a suggested plan for how the symposium will be conducted. Length: maximum 4 pages.

Posters: A poster proposal should include the aims of the study, a rationale of its theoretical or empirical character and a rationale to the conference theme. It will emphasize the use of appropriate visuals and adequate distribution onto A1 paper size. Length: maximum 4 pages. [Note: authors need to submit the 4 pages poster description for review and will need to bring the A1 size poster at the conference site by themselves as there will be no possibility to either print or store them].

The accepted papers, project presentations, symposia and posters will be published on the MES 9 website prior to the conference and in the printed conference proceedings that participants will receive upon arrival at the conference.

Procedures for Submission

For each submission the author should firstly create an account by registering in the website through the Log in / Sign in section. After creating your account, you will immediately receive an e-mail at your e-mail address. Please follow the instructions in order to activate the account. After that you can Log in through the Conference website and submit your

paper through the electronic platform (Main menu -> Submission -> Submit your Paper).

The submission form must be completed for each paper, making sure to include the title and the details of the contacting author(s). The submission form also includes a list of special sessions related to the conference for authors that find their paper topic relevant to these sessions. Finally, in order to select the file you wish to upload please use the Choose file button.

In order to facilitate the reviewing process, authors should name the file in the format 'LastnameFirstname initial in latin characters (e.g. SmithJ for John Smith). Please note that the file should not exceed the size of 1MB and that ONLY PDF file type is the accepted file format. Once you have ensured all the details are correct, please press the Submit button.

The Conference also provides the authors with the opportunity to Manage (Main menu -> Submission -> Manage your Submission) their submission until the submission deadline either by editing their initial submission or by deleting and re-submitting their paper.

After submitting your paper you will be automatically e-mailed with a reference number for your submission. Please, keep this e-mail as you will need this number should you wish to contact us regarding your abstract. Additionally, each time you update or delete your submission form you will be automatically informed about the changes.

- Write the paper in English.
- If you require language editing support, you need to submit your paper by 10th July 2016.
- Use the template available at the conference website. Please use this template without modifying it and without exceeding the limits indicated below.
- In order to facilitate the reviewing process, authors should name the file in the format 'LastnameFirstname initial in latin characters (e.g. SmithJ for John Smith).
- Please note that the file should not exceed the size of 1MB and that ONLY PDF file type is accepted.

(*) Eligible participants for reduced registration fee are authors who come from Low Income Countries. They need to submit an application to the MES community by 1st August 2016. Information concerning the application form and procedure of submission will be provided at the conference website. A team of MES scholars will provide criteria and evaluate applications chaired by Annica Anderson and David Kollosche.

(**) This fee applies to undergraduate students (BSc, MSc and similar) and postgraduate students without a salary or grant (*not PhD students who have salary or grant*). Registrants must provide a copy of their student ID card when registering. Please note that student or day registration excludes entry to the conference reception and conference dinner. Participants who wish to participate in these, must buy conference meals separately (see the registration form).

(***) This fee applies to people who aim only for ONE day registration.

Normal and reduced registration fee includes conference registration, a set of printed conference proceedings, conference material, meals (excluding alcoholic beverages) during the days of the conference, welcome reception dinner, conference dinner and coffee breaks.

Student and day registration fee includes conference registration, a set of printed proceedings, conference material and coffee breaks.
